FROM THE OFFICE

LAUNDRY FACILITIES

Complete laundry facilities are available to you. Laundry rooms will be open daily for your use. The management reserves the right to prohibit the use of the laundry rooms to anyone failing to comply with normal precautions and regulations. The laundry rooms are for residents' laundry only. No portable washing machines, dryers or dishwashers may be used in your apartment.

Clothes Washers

- Follow recommended loading instructions.
- Do not overload.
- Use correct amounts of detergent.
- Clean dispenser and lint filter <u>after</u> each use.
- Wipe off soap, bleach, and water from top of machine.
- Do not use it for tinting and dyeing.
- Leave the lid of door open after washing is finished so the interior will dry.
- If you accidentally wash a tissue or paper, please make sure that all shreds of the paper are removed from the washing machine and floor.
- You can use as many or all the machines that you need when you are doing laundry. The next person to come in will simply have to wait their turn.
- If you are using the washers in Clearview Terrace I area, please be respectful of the beauty shop customers. If the hair stylist is in the shop, please use only cold water when washing your clothes. This will prevent the beauty shop customers from getting a cold head of water!
- Please report to the office (leave a message if the office is closed) when a machine breaks down.
 Place a note on the machine so that no one tries to use it until it can be repaired.

Clothes Dryers

- Do not overload.
- Clean lint screen and trap <u>after each load</u> for faster drying.
- Place delicate items in laundry net for drying.
- Remove pins and other objects from clothing prior to drying.
- Remove wash and wear (perma-press) items from dryer as soon as cycle ends.
- Please remove your laundry from the washer and dryer as soon as it is done. Otherwise, the next resident wanting to use the machine has permission to remove your clothes.
- Please keep the lint filter in place while drying clothing.
- Please report to the office (leave a message if the office is closed) when a machine breaks down. Place a note on the machine so that no one tries to use it until it can be repaired.

Outside Clothes Lines

There are a few outside clothes lines provided for all tenants to use. Contact the office for the closest set of clotheslines nearest you. Please do not dry clothing on your porch. Do not drape clothing, towels, rugs, or shower mats over the railing of the porch or on your porch furniture.

Register to Vote

Would you like to have a voice in your local, state, and federal government?

If you are not a registered voter, and you want to be able to vote, stop into the Clearview Terrace office for a Pennsylvania Voter Registration Application.

You can also register to vote online. Go to register.votesPA.com. You can also use this form to change the information on your current PA Voter Registration.

To register you must be a United States citizen for at least 30 days before the next election, on April 23, 2024. You must be a resident of Pennsylvania and your election district for at least 30 days before the April 23 election. You must be at least 18 years of age on the day of the next election. If you have questions, call the County Voter Registration Office at 1-877-868-3772.

Fund Raising Credits

Residents who volunteer for fund raising events such as sub sales and yard sales are entitled to money credits. The profit of these fundraising events is split. One half goes into the social club and those funds are used to support tenant activities such as birthday parties, condolence flowers, "90 and above club" and more. The other half is put into the travel club for the tenants who helped. The amount of each credit is equal to one hour of volunteer work and the cash value varies depending on the profits.

Volunteers can ask for credits to be applied to mini-trips, bus trips, birthday lunches.








2024 Bus trips - \$40.00 'take out'





HEALTH and WELLNESS

Wellness Check with the VNA

Clearview Terrace continues to provide **free** blood pressure screenings for all residents. VNA nurses will gladly discuss with the tenants such topics as nutrition and dieting, weight management, stress, socialization, sleep issues, fitness and exercise and any other topic the tenant would like to discuss.

CT I automatic door

Please know that when using the automatic door by the offices in CT I, you need to stand off to the side by the silver button for the door to open properly. Look for the red light above the door. If you see a red dot, the door recognizes that someone or something is blocking the door and it will not open until the light disappears.

Safety First

Warmer weather often indicates an increase in criminal activity such as break-ins and loitering. Clearview Terrace is a safe, quiet neighborhood but we are not immune to bad people doing bad things.

It is important to feel safe and secure around your home. Here are a few tips for "staying safe".

- ALWAYS lock your car door.
- Check your car before entering to be sure that it has not been broken into.



- ALWAYS lock your apartment, even during the day when you are home. But don't lock your screen door during the night or when your inside door is locked. If you fall or become ill and need someone to enter your apartment, they will have to break the screen door to enter!
- Do NOT open your door to a person you do not know. People who look innocent could be up to no good.
- Don't hesitate to call 911 if you suspect suspicious behavior.
 For example, if you see a strange person walking around the buildings at night or hear strange noises, call 911.

If vandalism occurs to your personal property, like your car or outdoor decorations, you must **call 911** to file a police report. We cannot do this for you. We can only file a report on damage to property owned by Clearview Terrace. It is important to let police know when vandalism or trespassing occurs. This will increase surveillance in the area and will keep us safer.

<u>Light Bulbs - A Resident Responsibility</u>

Your tenant handbook explains that Clearview Terrace will provide working lights in your apartment when you move in. It is your responsibility to provide replacement light bulbs or purchase them from us. We will replace your porch light bulbs at no cost to you.

We will be glad to assist you in replacing the bulbs. We realize that ceiling lights require a ladder or stool and can be a challenge to reach. When you call the office to request a work order for replacing a bulb, please make sure you have a replacement bulb ready or let us know that you need to purchase a bulb from us. We stock fluorescent tube lights for bathroom and kitchen sinks. The fluorescent bulbs cost \$9.00 each. The cost of other bulbs differs depending on the light fixture.

In Clearview Terrace III, all light fixtures are designed to accept energy efficient bulbs. You can call the office for the type of light bulb you need to purchase, or you can purchase the bulb from us. Call for prices.

Spring Cleanup

Residents of CTA who no longer want to or are unable to tend to the flowerbed near their apartment are asked to call the office. The flowerbed will be converted to a grassy area for mowing.

Some Recycling Tips

We are finding aluminum and steel cans mixed together in the recycling barrels. An easy way to tell the difference is to hold a magnet to the can. If the magnet sticks, it is a steel can.



Examples of steel cans are vegetable, fruit, and some pet food cans. Examples of aluminum cans are soda and beer cans.

Please remember to take the cans out of plastic bags before placing them in the barrel.

Please remember to break down all cardboard if able; if not able to break down the cardboard, please contact the office. And please do not recycle greasy pizza boxes.

Yard Sale 2024 - May 8, 9 and 10

We will be having our Spring Yard Sale on Wednesday, May 8 (tenants ONLY), Thursday, May 9 and Friday, May 10.

Now what? It is time to 'clean' out some things from your apartment you no longer need or want. We will start accepting donated items in our library in CT I starting **Monday, April 1** during the hours of 8:00 – 4:00. Please NO after hour and weekend drop offs. We will take donated items from the library in CT I and place them in a locked storage area each day. Deadline for drop-offs will be Monday, April 29, 2024. Please mark this date on your calendars!!!!!!!!!!!

What can I donate? Jewelry, shoes, clothing, household items, hand-made crafts and paintings, baked goods, books, DVDs, CDs, potted plants, small furniture items. NO electronics. Any and all furniture will be picked up the week of the Yard Sale and a request for pick up should be called to the office as a work order.

What supplies are needed? Beef hot dogs, hot dog rolls, relish, ketchup, mustard, soda (cans – see Kathy for what is needed <u>before</u> you go shopping)

How can I help?

- Volunteer to help sort and price donated items each Tuesday in April starting at 12:30 pm (after lunch). Experienced volunteers will help with all the details involved. Sign in and out for 'credit' hours.
- Volunteer to work on the days of our yard sale. A work preference sheet is available in the office. Your work schedule will be available the week before the yard sale. We need 12-15 volunteers each day. Most positions do NOT require a lot of standing. You need not work every day or all day.
- Take Yard Sale flyers to local businesses laundromats, restaurants, markets, clubs, and banks you visit on a regular basis.
- Consider baking items for our sale fudge, rice Krispie treats, small cakes, cookies, muffins, etc. Have all baked goods to the office by 12:00 pm on Wednesday, May 8.

Exterminator Visits

The exterminator visits Clearview Terrace on Wednesday, April 10 and 24, between the hours of 10:00 am and 2:00 pm.

If you need service, please call the office to be placed on the schedule.

We continue our 'routine' apartment inspections with the Orkin technician and a staff member. You will be contacted by office staff prior to your scheduled inspection. Please make every effort to be at home to assist maintenance staff and the Orkin technician properly identify your pest and/or insect issues.

Bed Bugs

We would like to remind you of some simple steps you can take to avoid being infested or spreading bed bugs.

- Check your sheets for tell-tale blood spots. Use a flashlight to examine the edges of your mattress or upholstered furniture to look for the bugs that resemble small, brown, round ticks.
- Consider bringing a large plastic trash bag to keep your suitcase in during hotel stays or when visiting friends and relatives.
- Vacuum suitcases after returning from a vacation. Immediately throw away the contents of your vacuum or the bag.
- When you travel, carry a small flashlight to assist you with quick visual inspections of the mattress and furniture.
- Never bring second-hand furniture, especially upholstered furniture, mattresses and box springs into your apartment.
- Regularly inspect areas where pets sleep for signs of bed bugs.
- Wash and dry (using a dryer, not a clothesline) new and used clothing. (Yes, bed bugs have been known to spread from clothing purchased in stores).
- Bed bugs are elusive creatures. They are hard to spot in the daytime because they do not like daylight. It is imperative to call the office if you suspect bed bugs. We will have our exterminator service inspect your apartment and begin treatment.

The treatment of bed bugs is expensive, costing Clearview Terrace thousands of dollars. We appreciate your help in preventing them from infesting your apartment and quickly reporting to us if you suspect a problem. We now will charge tenants the cost of treating bed bugs. Please use the tips found above to prevent bed bug infestation.



Air Conditioner Covers

Usually, in mid-April, the maintenance staff will remove the air conditioner cover on **all** apartments in Clearview Terrace II (apts. 51-112) allowing you to use your AC unit.

If you do not want your cover removed, please notify the office.

Air Conditioner Electricity Fee

April is the month when residents in Clearview I and II (apartments 1 to 112) pay in full or begin payment of their electric bill that pays for operating the window air conditioner(s).

The cost for the year is \$45.00 for each AC unit in your apartment. If you wish to break down your payments over the course of the next few months, here is a schedule of payments:

One payment of \$45.00 Two payments of \$22.50

P.S. You can include the electric payment <u>with your rent check</u>. You don't have to give us two separate checks! And, as a reminder, that if you have two air conditioners, your payment is double.

Disposal of Large Items – mainly furniture

Clearview Terrace pays the Hanover Borough for commercial trash removal. This does not include the cost of removing large items like sofa and mattress. Residents <u>must</u> contact the Hanover Borough office 717-637-3877 to arrange to pay for the removal and set a time to have it picked up. You then arrange payment for any large item (that should not be thrown in the dumpster). After payment, call Hanover Borough Public Works to arrange for pickup at 717-632-3939.

Procedure is as follows:

- Go to the Borough office to pay for item(s) to be picked up and schedule pick up date.
- Place item(s) by dumpster nearest your apartment on date provided by Public Works.
- Watch to see that item(s) are picked up on the date agreed upon!

Do Not Feed Outdoor Animals

Please do not place food outside to feed domestic or wild animals. We know this practice draws skunks and squirrels.



We have received complaints about a skunk smell. And oh my, those pesky squirrels! They eat cloth on chairs, chew through wires on your car and create havoc at planters and gardens. We are also experiencing phone disruptions due to squirrels feeding on phone lines.

Do not place kitchen waste or pet food outside! You can use bird seed to feed birds, but no peanuts, walnuts, breadcrumbs, or cereal, please. Make every effort to clean up bird seed that falls to the ground.

Have you noticed the huge mound of mulch by the maintenance shed? We have mulch. If you need mulch for your flowerbed, please contact the office to make it a work order. DO NOT approach the guys while on the property!!! Call the office during our office hours, Monday-Friday, 8:00 am - 4:00 pm.

Sub Sale - Bonus

When you **volunteer** to help with the sub sale, you are helping Clearview Terrace raise money that is used for so many things. What to do after a car accident: a step-by-step guide:

- 1. Check yourself for injuries. If you're injured, call 911 or ask someone else to do so.
- 2. Check on the well-being of your passengers and the driver of the other car.
- 3. Get to safety. If you see smoke or smell gasoline, get far away from the vehicles involved.
- 4. Call 911 to report the accident/crash.
- 5. Wait for help. Stay near the vehicles involved, waiting for EMS or police to arrive.
- 6. Exchange information. After making sure you and any passengers are uninjured, exchange contact and insurance information with the other driver. Here's the most important information drivers should exchange after an accident:
- Full name and contact information
- Insurance company and policy number
- Driver's license and license plate number
- Type, color, and model of vehicle
- Location of accident.
- 7. Document the accident. Take pictures of your vehicle if you can and take a picture of the other vehicle including the license plate. Take down names of the other driver as well as the police officers who responded to the accident.
- 8. Notify your insurer and start the claims process.
