First Energy Upgrades

Starting on Monday, October 30 and lasting until Friday, November 3, CLEAResult, a partner of Met Ed/First Energy will be visiting each apartment in Clearview Terrace I and II, and those in Clearview III that applied for an energy efficiency study.



Each day starting at 9:00 a.m. one of our staff members along with a team from CLEAResult will visit our apartments. They will check the energy efficiency of your refrigerator. If it is not energy efficient, the refrigerator will be replaced at a future date. They will also check light bulbs and replace them with LED light bulbs. They might also check to ensure that smart power strips are being used on computers. LED night lights will be offered to you as well. We will start with apartment 1 on Monday, October 30. I expect that they will be able to visit about twenty apartments each day. We will send out a phone call at the end of each day to alert you to our visit. The visits each day will end around 4:00 p.m.

This is a free service to you that will help us save on our energy bill and assure that your apartment has the most energy efficient refrigerator and lights. We appreciate your cooperation while we conduct this study. Please feel free to call the office if you have any questions.

Voluntary Water Restrictions

Considering the current weather conditions, with sporadic yet insufficient rainfall, the Borough of Hanover is implementing proactive measures to ensure the longevity of our water supply.

The Borough kindly requests your cooperation in voluntarily reducing water usage.

Here are some suggested conservation measures:

- Skip the car wash
- Run the washing machine less often
- Water your garden and flowers in the cooler evening and morning hours
- Repair household leaks (Call the Clearview Terrace office if you find a drip or leak)

Due to these current restrictions, power washing of buildings in Clearview Terrace is on hold.

Blessing of the Animals

Save the Date: Wednesday, October 4 at 3:00 in the courtyard by CT I community room. Bring your pet on a leash or in a carrier or bring a photo of your current or past pet. Reverend Carenda Baker will be here to bless your pet.

Here is a little background on this tradition. Oct. 4 is the feast day of St. Francis, patron saint of animals. Many churches celebrate by inviting our animal friends to be blessed. Check Your Thermostat

Cooler weather is here and many of you will be turning your heat on if you have not already done so. This is the time to look at your thermostat to be sure it is working. Make sure the switch is turned to "Heat" (bottom right side of thermostat above the button on the right). You should see the temperature of the apartment on the screen (number on the left). The temperature you want to set the heat at <u>must be higher</u> than the room temperature. If there is no visible light coming from the thermostat, you might need new batteries. Either replace the batteries or call the office to request a work order.



<u>Stink Bugs</u>

It is the time of year that stink bugs search for shelter from the cold. You might find them seeking a sun bath by attaching to the outside of the siding on your apartment. They will also search for small cracks to enter inside a warm home. Stink bugs get their name from the unpleasant odor they produce when they are threatened. The smell has often been compared to strong herbs like cilantro and coriander.



The brown marmorated stink bug found in this area is oval shaped. They are nearly as wide as they are long. Their legs extend from the sides, so this makes the adult bugs look even bigger. Here is a picture of an adult stink bug. They have wings and antennae.

This type of stink bug cannot sting and is not likely to bite. It feeds on plants and likes everything from weeds to ornamental plants to crops (not the farmer's favorite friend). If you find a stink bug inside your apartment, DON'T crush it because it will release its odor. Carefully sweep them up and put them outside. If you vacuum them up, the smell could linger inside your vacuum cleaner. If you have an infestation of bugs, call the office to be placed on the exterminator list.

<u>Air Conditioner Covers for Apartments 51 to 112 (CT II)</u>

Beginning in mid-October the maintenance crew will place the covers on the window air conditioner units of Clearview Terrace II (apartments 51 to 112).

If you do not wish to have a cover placed on the unit, call the office before October 12. After October, no covers will be placed on the AC units.

Many of your apartments have a metal plate that is used to cover the opening in the wall where your air conditioner is located. You might not have a cover in your apartment because over the years we have lost many covers mostly because when tenants move out of the apartment, they or their families do not know what the metal plate is used for, and they throw it away!

If you keep your air conditioner in all year round and you are not using the metal plate to cover the opening, please call the office and we will visit to collect it. It will free up your storage space and avoid it from being lost or thrown away when you vacate your apartment.

Fire Prevention Week 2023 ----- October 8-14, 2023





Do you know what the acronym PASS stands for?

Clearview Terrace provides a fire extinguisher in your apartment and in the community areas. Here are some simple steps using the acronym "PASS" on how to use your extinguisher:



First you must twist off the plastic tie that holds the pin in place.

Then you:

- Pull the pin (round, metal loop at top)
- Aim the hose
- Squeeze top handle and
- Sweep (back and forth at the **base** of the fire)
- If the fire is in your trash can, smother it with something to get the fire out.
- If the fire is on your stove, aim the fire extinguisher at the range hood and let it deflect the extinguishing material to the fire; do not aim at the stove itself.



Other Safety Tips:

Smoke Alarms – Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in a home fire in half; test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button (have a family member do it if you are not able).

Cooking – cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries; the leading cause is unattended cooking – stay in your kitchen when preparing food in your oven or on your stove.

Heating – heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fires during the winter; space heaters are usually the type of heaters that cause the most fires; keep anything that can burn 3 feet from any heating equipment.

Mobility Scooter Safety

Here are a few commonsense things to remember when using your mobility scooter at Clearview Terrace and the surrounding neighborhoods.

- As a mobility scooter or powerchair driver, you are exempt from rules and regulations that are applicable to vehicles. However, safety is still important, and you should keep in mind that while you are not considered a vehicle, you are considered a pedestrian and should always drive with both safety and courtesy in mind.
- 2. Wear a safety vest with reflective tape so you can easily be seen by pedestrians and drivers.
- 3. Use slow speed when you are on Clearview Terrace sidewalks. This will prevent you from running into someone who steps in your path.
- 4. Consider putting a safety color flag at the top of a pole on your scooter. Again, this will help people see you coming when you are hidden from their sight by other vehicles.
- 5. If you must use your scooter during dark hours, find a light to attach to your scooter to make it easier for people to see you.

Common Q & A about scooters:

1. Do I need a license to operate a mobility scooter?

Nope! An operator's license is not required to operate a mobility scooter.

2. Is there a minimum driving age?

Anyone at any age can operate a mobility scooter!

3. Do I need to register my mobility scooter?

Because mobility scooters are not considered to be vehicles, you do not need to register your mobility scooter.

4. Do I need to insure my mobility scooter?

Just like registration, you are not required to insure your mobility scooter. However, if you are interested in ensuring your mobility scooter or powerchair, liability and physical damages are normally included in your home/renters insurance policy. Contact your insurance provider for specifics.

5. Do I need to wear a helmet?

Since they are categorized differently from motorcycles, electric bikes and scooters and bicycles, you are not required to wear a helmet when riding a mobility scooter. However, you may want to consider wearing one if you are going to encounter uneven terrain.



Some Common Sense First Aid Advice

Living in a senior community sometimes presents some unique situations. Chances are that you will encounter someone who has a medical emergency. First thing you need to do is recognize the emergency. Look, listen and smell for unusual things. For example, your neighbor who always gets up at the crack of dawn, still has their blinds closed at 9 a.m. Or maybe you smell the odor of natural

gas. Or you hear glass breaking or the muffled sound of someone calling for help. Or something more obvious; a neighbor who is lying on the sidewalk!

Follow the three C rules: Check, Call, Care

Check the Scene- first check the scene to make sure it is safe for you to approach the person. An example of an unsafe scene might be the person's dog that is growling and showing their teeth. You could be bitten if you get too close. If the scene is safe, then check the person for injuries or illness.

Call 911. If the person has a life-threatening injury or illness or you are not sure what to do, call 911. It is common for the injured person to tell you not to call for help, but you don't have to have their permission to call 911. When the emergency personnel arrive on the scene, they will check the person, care for them, and sometimes recommend a trip to the hospital. The injured or ill person can refuse to go. Then the ambulance staff will have them sign a release form.

Care for the Person – If you have first aid or CPR training, you can care for the person until emergency personnel arrive and take over. If you don't know what to do, the 911 operator will give you step-by-step instructions on how to keep the person safe and comfortable until help arrives.

<u>Remember your three Cs</u> – **Check** the scene and victim, **Call** 911 if you find life threatening emergency and **Care** for the victim. You can do a lot to help someone.

Updated List of Tenant Phone Numbers



In the November newsletter, we would like to include a list of tenants, their apartment number and phone number. If you have changed your phone number recently, please notify the office of your new number. If you DO NOT want some or all of this information published in the newsletter, please contact the office before **Thursday, October 12**.

If we did not publish your number in last year's list, we will not publish it this year unless you give us permission to do so or if you moved in this year and requested that we keep your number private, we will not publish it unless you give us permission.

Did you change your phone number?

Residents who make a change to their phone number or have a phone number disconnected should contact the office so we can keep our phone numbers updated. This is particularly important for our 'One Call Now' system which we use for our group phone calls.

Emergency Contact Information

Every year we update each tenant's emergency contact information. This form is used by Clearview Terrace staff to contact your family if you have an emergency or to give to emergency medical personnel if they need to contact your family. Please complete the form found on the back of this newsletter and drop it off at the office as soon as possible. This form has been very helpful when a tenant becomes ill or is not answering their door or phone, and we had to reach a family member. Thank you for helping us to provide better service to you! Contact information remains confidential.

Overnight Guests – information for ALL residents

Your Tenant Handbook explains that if you have overnight guests for more than two nights, you need to notify the office, identify the person, and provide make and license of their care. Many residents don't read any further in this part of your handbook. The next paragraph states that "a stay of more than ten days within a calendar year by another person(s) should be discussed with the manager." This includes, for example, a person who spends one night every week. If they have stayed more than ten days in the calendar year, please discuss this with management. They could have outstayed their welcome

Faster Response Time for Ambulance

If you become ill or injured in your apartment and need to call 911, please let the EMS dispatcher know if you cannot open your door and let them know if your door is locked. If your apartment door is locked, they can get a key to your apartment from our KNOX Box. The KNOX Box is situated outside the office and can only be opened by career fire and EMS personnel. This allows for a rapid, non-destructive entrance to your apartment.

Letting the 911 dispatcher know that your door is locked will save time. When the ambulance arrives at Clearview Terrace, they will first get the key and then respond to your apartment. It will save a lot of time and extra suffering while you wait for the ambulance or fire team to go back to the office to open the box and get our key.



Hud Re-certification Procedures -CT I and II residents only



Residents in CT I and II who participate in the HUD re-certification process should note we are continuing the procedure we started at the beginning of the pandemic. When your apartment is inspected, you will receive a worksheet to be completed that will provide information on income, assets, and medical expenses; all the items used in calculating your rent. You are to complete the worksheet and provide your Social Security benefit amount letter, information on assets (name of bank and 6 months bank statements) and ALL receipts for medical expenses you paid for in the last year and were not reimbursed for from the vendor. **That information is to be handed in to the office ONE week prior to your re-certification meeting**. Tenants are welcome to bring their own pen for signing the necessary papers for their recertification.


